## **FREE DOWNLOADABLE APPS FROM UNSW LIBRARY FOR CONJOINTS!!**

It is with pleasure that UNSW Library services are made available to Conjoints of the Faculty of Medicine. There are two highly recommended apps which are easily downloadable to your mobile devices (eg, iphone/ipad, Blackberry or Google's Android):

BEST PRACTICE  
ACCESS MEDICINE

***Best Practice*** is a single source brought to you by the BMJ Evidence Centre, which combines the latest research evidence, guidelines and expert opinion – presented in a step-by-step approach, covering prevention, diagnosis, treatment and prognosis. Best Practice provides a second opinion in an instant, without the need for checking multiple resources. Its unique patient-focused approach represents a major new advancement in information delivery at the point of care.

You are likely to find that this should **replace paying for Up to Date** or other commercial point of care tools.

***AccessMedicine ebooks*** is a downloadable connection to online medical textbooks including Harrisons Online, Current Diagnosis & Treatment (series), Pocket Guide to Diagnostic Tests, Schwartz's Principles of Surgery, etc. (full list is at the end of this document, or check out [AccessMedicine](#)).

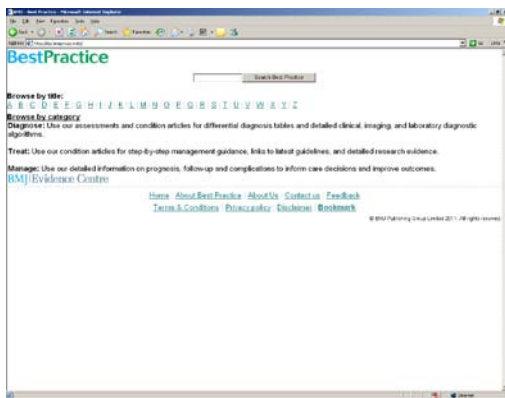
NB: You will need to be in a wifi-enabled area or use your personal mobile access. Many hospitals have wifi but may not publicise it- ask your School administrator to investigate obtaining the access password!

To set up *Best Practice on your mobile device*

Best Practice can be accessed via any internet-enabled mobile phone, PDA or handheld device.

Step 1: Go to [Best Practice](#) through UNSW library to set up a 'My *Best Practice*' account. This allows Best Practice to know that you are accessing through the UNSW library institutional license. You will need your UNSW zPASS (ask your School conjoint liaison admin person to help you or obtain online via <http://www.library.unsw.edu.au/servicesfor/conjoint.html>). You will be asked to set your own Best Practice login and password.

Step 2: Once set up, go to your mobile device (eg iphone or ipad or Blackberry) and log in (via Safari or your mobile web browser) to **bp.bmjgroup.mobi**, the *Best Practice* mobile platform



- You will be asked for your 'My *Best Practice*' email and password which you set up in Step 1.

All future access for 6 months will not need any passwords. You may be able to use your mobile device to add an icon on your phone/ipad (eg, on iPhone, click on + and 'Add to Home Screen')

You can also access Best Practice on any PC or Mac with your 'My *Best Practice*' email and password for 6 months, without going through the UNSW Library. If you cannot get direct access (firewalls etc) you can access through UNSW Library via Sirius: [Best Practice](#).

To set up *ACCESS MEDICINE ebooks on your mobile device*

The AccessMedicine mobile view is optimised for the following smartphone operating systems: iPhone, Google's Android, and BlackBerry Bold.

Step 1: Go to [AccessMedicine](#) through UNSW library

Step 2: Create your own account which is called "My Access Medicine Personal Profile"

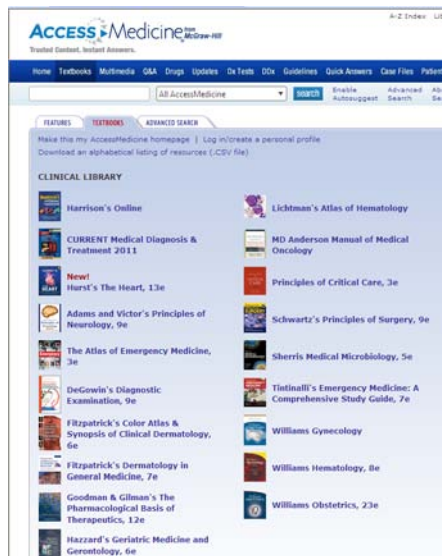
Step 3: On your mobile device, go via Safari or your mobile web browser to **m.accessmedicine.com**

Step 4: Log in with account created in Step 2. (You may be able to use your mobile device to add an icon on your phone/ipad (eg, on iPhone, click on + and 'Add to Home Screen')

Step 5: To access from a fixed computer, go through the UNSW Library via [Sirius: AccessMedicine](#).
